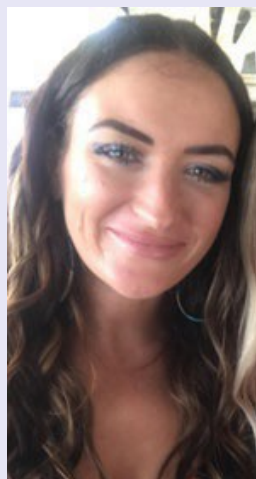


Primary Parents in Partnership Committee Members

Chantelle Daniels (Committee Member)

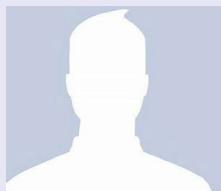
